V: At his baptism in the Jordan your Holy Spirit descended upon him like a dove

V: ... and you declared him your beloved Son.

V: With your Spirit upon him Jesus turned away the temptations of sin.

V: Your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor,

V: ... to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind,

V: ... to set at liberty those who are oppressed,

V: ... and to announce that the time had come when you would save your people.

V: Jesus healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with sinners.

**By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection, you gave birth to your Church,
delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and
the Spirit. When the Lord Jesus ascended, he promised to be with us always, baptizing us
with the Holy Spirit and with fire, as on the Day of Pentecost.**

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, when the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave the cup to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."
