## **Types of Manuscripts**

Papyrus = Autographs - about the 8th Century

Mostly "amatures" or "non-scriptora" productions

Mostly proto-Alexandrian and Alexandrian Type

Uncials = mid-2nd Century - 11th Century

Some "amatures" but mostly Scriptora productions

Heavily Aleandrian early on, progressively more Byzantine as time went on.

Miniscules = 9th Century -- 16th Century

Mostly Scriptora Productions

Mostly Byzantine, though some interesting Alexandrian Type examples exist.

\*\*\*

The majority of our Manuscripts are Byzatine Miniscules post 10th Century AD Most of our earliest are either Alexandrian or are more like the Alexandrian mss than Byzantine The earliest Byzantine manuscripts have FEWER Byzantine readings than the later ones.

Alexandranus is an example of a manuscript that, in the Gospels, is Byzantine but less-so than Manuscript Pi, which dates to the 9th Century. For instance:

In the Gospels, Alexandranus has 151 variant readings that agree with the Byzantine Type

And 18 variants that agree with the Alexandrian Type

And 15 variants that are unique to it

In the Gospels, Pi has 190 variant readings that agree with the Byzantine Type

And 11 variants that agree with the Alexandrian Type

And 18 variants that are unique to it
